CAMERON BAILEY is the Artistic Director of TIFF, one of the world's leading film organizations. He is responsible for TIFF's curatorial vision as a not-for-profit with the mission to transform the way people see the world through film. Toronto Life has named Cameron one of Toronto's 50 Most Influential people for five consecutive years.

Cameron began his career as a film critic and started work as a programmer for the Toronto International Film Festival in 1990. He founded its Planet Africa section and has led the Festival's overall programming since 2008.

In addition to his work at TIFF, Cameron has taught film curation at the University of Toronto and sits on the Advisory Council for Western University's School for Arts and Humanities. He is a former board member of Tourism Toronto and the Royal Ontario Museum's Institute for Contemporary Culture.

Born to Barbadian parents in London, England, Cameron lived in Barbados as a child for four years, and started school at St. Boniface Primary School in St. James. He resides with his wife and their son in Toronto.
